

The River Darwen Litter Trap



What does the trap do? The trap catches floating litter and debris, stopping it from being washed downstream, spoiling the landscape, harming wildlife and habitats.

Where is the trap? Most of the litter problems come from the River Blakewater so the trap is in the River Darwen at Witton Country Park just downstream of the River Blakewater confluence, near the main car park.


