Cheshire's Floating Garden Festival

Saturn, a restored Shropshire Union Fly Boat, will start its journey from Audlem on Sunday 8 June calling into Nantwich Marina and Barbridge before finally reaching Middlewich in time on join in the Folk & Boat Festival celebrations.



Audlem is an ever-popular picturesque village in set beside the Shropshire Union Canal. With characteristic canalside hosterleries, Audlem is a popular stop-off point for walkers and canal cruisers, as well as a popular destination for several summertime events and festivals.

Called Aldelime in the Doomsday Book, Audlem's market charter was granted in 1296 and St James' Church dates from the late 13th century. Audlem is famous for its 15 locks on the Shropshire Union Canal, Thomas Telford's last project.
